Site visit feedback -

On May 19, 2016 we had a site visit from LaVencia Sugar, our DFC Grant Program Specialist. There were several coalition members present who met with her the entire day and thoroughly discussed various areas of the coalition such as assessment, capacity building, strategic planning, implementation, evaluation and competency. We met the requirements in every category and were asked to follow up in areas where technical assistance was recommended, these areas included how to increase engagement with media, youth and the business community.

Dr. Corey Waller Presentation, September 28th

Dr. Corey Waller is an addiction, pain, and emergency medicine specialist and the Senior Medical Director for Education and Policy at the Camden Coalition of Healthcare Providers (CCHP). He will be joining us for a community presentation on September 28th. He will be speaking to medical professionals from 7am-9am at Agro Liquid Fertilizer, the title of the presentation is "Responsible Prescribing for Health Care Professionals". Dr. Waller will be presenting a second session that will be a Tri-County event – all coalitions have partnered together. This will be held at the Hannah Center in East Lansing on September 28th from 11a.m. – 3 p.m. This will be geared more toward human service agencies, law enforcement, parents, and public health professionals. Capital Counties Commit: Kate Neese

Kate was not able to attend the meeting today, however, she did send an update: CCC released a second PSA focused on securing your medication. The public can search medication disposal sites on the website www.capitalcountiescommit.org and are encouraged to do so. The CCC group is working on new handouts which will be given to pharmacies willing to share the info. Members of each County Substance Abuse Council may be enlisted to help contact local pharmacies and share the informational handouts once the group is done developing them.

The Free for Fall event is coming up Saturday, September 17th from 8am to 1pm at the Granger facility on Wood Road. They will be accepting medications at this event along with sharps, other household hazardous waste (including used oil & antifreeze, oil based paint, pool chemicals and yard chemicals), electronics, books, reusable household items and reusable construction items. No appointment is needed at this event but it is limited to Clinton County residents.

Their next medication collection will be held during the annual Community Health Fair on Saturday, September 24th from 9am to Noon at Agro Culture Liquid Fertilizer. They will also be collecting mercury health thermometers and handing out information on proper sharps disposal.
