CSAPC Executive Committee Meeting Minutes Wednesday, October 7, 2015 SJPD, 8:30 – 9:00 a.m.

Present: Kyle Knight, Marie Barks, Sara Thelen, Gary Owen, Polly Brainerd

- Structure of CSAPC meetings
 - We reviewed the September 16th CSAP coalition meeting and the apparent consensus that bi-monthly meetings make the most sense with committee meetings on alternating months. We were encouraged that people want to stay engaged in the coalition.
 - We briefly discussed the possible types of working committees: such as prescription drugs, ROSC, youth use of alcohol, youth use of marijuana and will seek coalition input
 - We agreed to discuss the committee meeting structure with the coalition at the November 18th meeting.
- Project Alert
 - Polly shared the input we had from Mid-State Health Network (MSHN) on how we could continue to have our police partners provide Project Alert. MSHN asked that we have a Certified Prevention Specialist provide oversight this fiscal year. Next year we may have new guidance/requirements. Polly qualifies in that role.
 - Polly will put together a pre- and post-test that will be brief and provide focused on outcomes without duplicating the MiPHY questions. Classes in Dewitt and St. John's will start in January. Kyle will get Polly the post-survey data for the final report.
- Compliance Checks
 - Kyle reported that the checks are completed. He shared the results with us. The percentage went down from last year on alcohol sales. Kyle is going to have a meeting with the Sheriff to discuss the results and offer suggestions for protocol change for those vendors that were non-compliant.
 - We will put an update on the compliance checks outcomes on the November full coalition agenda and ask the coalition or committee for feedback and next steps.
- School Meetings
 - Bath and Dewitt are scheduled.
 - Sara reported that Ovid-Elsie will be talking to principals and will pull together and also mentioned the county principals meeting.
 - Our goal is to solicit commitment to doing the MiPHY, provide an overview DFC grant, mention PALs and Project Alert as indicated. We'll also discuss the possibility of conducting focus groups with the students to see what direction we can head as a coalition to see how we can best help their community. We'll promote our coalition as a resource in our county to work on issues that are impacting them.
 - Kyle said he'd assist us in making connections in Pewamo-Westphalia
- ROSC
 - We have a meeting scheduled with Clinton County Counseling Center and Wellness InX later this morning.
- DFC
 - Sara reported that the DFC grant has about \$16,000-19,000 to carry over and we'll need to have coalition approval for the projects being considered: PALs literacy media project; sending an additional coalition member to attend the CADCA leadership trainings; a nice display board. We have examples of ones from Saginaw and Genesee that were great
 - Sara also shared that Rex from the MMDHD put together a 30 slide ppt. on our Mi-PHY data. We discussed whether carry over funds could be used to hire a graphic designer to put together some data infographics.

We adjourned the meeting to head over the ROSC Committee meeting.
