- Review draft Coalition agenda
 - We reviewed the minutes from the previous Executive Committee meeting and reviewed the draft agenda for the November 18th CSAP Coalition meeting.
- By-law change
 - We reviewed the by-laws and decided to wait to suggest any changes until a later meeting, probably in January.
- CSAP Coalition meeting on 11/18
 - We reviewed the agenda and developed the structure for the meeting. Several ideas were suggested to help us prepare for committees. Ideas will be presented and discussed at the CSAP meeting and coalition approval will be sought.
 - Polly suggested an activity to engage discussion around what committees we want using data and specific topics. Small groups will review a piece of data and then respond to two questions: What are the highlights of the data you are reviewing? What should be a next step for the coalition committee on this subject to take?
 - If we met as a coalition every other month, we want the committees to feel as though the alternative month we meet in committees is meaningful.
 - We discussed the suggestion of meeting every month and carving 15 minutes out of the coalition meeting for committees meet and then report out.
 - One suggestion was to have the activity in November, skip December (executive committee meets) and then begin our committees in January.
- School Visit Updates
 - Sara and Polly met with Bath administrators and Dewitt administrators about the MiPHY and CSAP coalition activities. We gave them information on how to get involved in PALs and Project Alert. Both districts are committed to doing the MiPHY. We are meeting with Fowler today. Bath is interested in our support and assistance in analyzing their MiPHY data.
- DFC update
 - Sara will be proposing to the CSAP Coalition several suggestions for utilizing the carry over DFC funds.
 - We had been talking about adding marijuana as a substance use risk and core objectives to the DFC. Sara will need to do that formally for the DFC grant and will need CSAP Coalition approval.
 - Our DFC Project Director will be attending a coalition and/or EC meeting sometime in the spring.
 - We will be seeking a vote on the carryover and adding marijuana to the DFC grant at our November 18th meeting.
