### Meeting Minutes

**Wednesday, December 20, 2017**

LeeAnna opened the meeting at 8:30 a.m. We did introductions. LeeAnna had us review the vision and mission. We looked over the agenda and minutes. LeeAnna made a motion to accept the meeting minutes and agenda. Joel supported the motion. **Motion carried.**

#### **CSAPC Member Highlight – Haley Hastings, The SafeCenter**

Haley works at SafeCenter. She graduated from Haslett High School and then got her Bachelor's degree from Grand Valley. After an internship working foster care in Grand Rapids, she began working at SafeCenter. She enjoys the position very much. Starting in the fall, Haley will begin her Master's degree in social work. She likes to spend time with friends and family and goes up north in the summer at Higgins Lake. Haley nominated Darlene for the next month.

#### **MSHN Year End Report**

Polly reviewed the year-end report required by MSHN outlining our coalition accomplishments with our prevention plan.

Shari Granville introduced herself and discussed the MI Bridges initiative. We discussed her involvement with Clinton County's resources through MI Bridges and we invited her to provide a presentation on the project at our January meeting. She also offered to take event flyers with her to meet with churches in the community.

#### **Items for Discussion/Action**

We reviewed November Action Items and provided updates on their status.

#### **Youth Marijuana Use**

LeeAnna provided an update on East Lansing's ordinance regarding marijuana manufacturing and provisioning. The city is allowing manufacturing and dispensaries. A small part of Clinton County is in East Lansing. Previously, East Lansing was going to allow manufacturing in the sod farms in that annexed area. Anne Hill was able to mobilize neighborhood associations and attended many city council meetings. As of last week, the council did approve facilities but they changed the zoning so that there are only three very small areas allowed for growing marijuana. Bath Township still has control over water and sewer and they have no interest in approving using those utilities for marijuana manufacturing. The owner of the other two properties in that area is not interested as well. The coalition expressed appreciation for all of Anne's efforts. Polly made a motion to send a letter of appreciation to Anne. Leeanna supported the motion. **Motion Carried. Action: Polly will compose the letter and have Marie sign it.**

#### **General Substance Use**

Youth Crime in St. Johns - We discussed the increase in youth criminal activity/HCC meeting update. Next meeting of the HCC is in January. Hopefully this topic will be on the agenda. Polly shared that St. Johns Police Department applied for PA2 dollar funds for materials to support the mural along the pedestrian trail.

Take Back Meds Flyer - Leslie Kinney from MMDHD created the Take Back Medications flyer based on feedback from the Take Back Meds committee. LeeAnna pointed out that we need to fix on the photo on the flyer so that it included controlled and non-controlled medications. She also said Karen is willing to distribute the flyers through Great Start.

Poverty Simulation Funding – Polly explained that St. Johns Area Community Foundation approved \$500 toward the Poverty Simulation, but that we needed another \$750 to pay for it. Chris moved that we use CSAPC discretionary funds to put toward the total expenses of \$1,250. Shari supported the motion. **Motion carried.** Marie suggested getting an article in the Clinton Co. and Bath Review newspapers. Shari suggested promoting it at the Rotary and Chamber of Commerce. Chad encouraged us to use our social media to promote this.

### **Upcoming CSAPC events promotion**

Chronic Pain PATH-Christina shared that they are having the workshop at Clinton Co. Medical Center. There are currently 8 people signed up. Christine asked for the contact for the newspaper. **Action: Marie will send Christine the newspaper contacts.**

Mental Health 1<sup>st</sup> Aid Training-we have about 20 people signed up and registration is still open until mid-January. Polly will bring morning refreshments. Nan through Sparrow Clinton Hospital is providing lunch.  
3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Clinton Prevention Forum 4/10-Polly gave an update on the event and will send the flyer out electronically.  
Judge Jodi Town Hall, Dewitt 5/3 – We decided to wait until our January meeting to discuss the flyers for this event.  
Laughing, Loving, Leading Conference is on March 17<sup>th</sup> at CCRESA. They changed the format so that Dr. Stephanie Grant can have more time to talk on childhood trauma and toxic stress. There will be three different breakout sessions.

Lifesavers-Joel shared that the tri-county suicide prevention initiative is a collaborative that CEI-CMH and Eaton RESA initiated. CEI-CMH has Jody Nelson taking the lead with this coalition. Those invited to the Lifesavers meetings include legislators and area networks within the state locally. Three main objectives: prevention, preparedness and response. Meetings are the first Friday of the month from 9 – 11. The next meeting is January 5<sup>th</sup> at Ingham Health Department. If you are interested, feel free to let Joel know. **Action: Joel will add LeeAnna to the email list.**

Older Adults in the Know Conference. The first planning meeting on January 3<sup>rd</sup> at 11 a.m. at Caring and Sharing.

### **Recent Conferences – all**

Sara discussed the upcoming CADCA conference in February. We are still hoping that two St. Johns youth can attend given our coalition's desire to sponsor youth at one of the two CADCA conferences. We have funding for only 4-5 spots for the entire year. If they cannot attend in February, we hope to send youth in July.

Several coalition members attended the Healthy! Capital Communities meeting. It was very informative and they intend to have three more meetings over the year.

Joel went to a Wellness Conference. Many organizations are interested in shifting to having Wellness in their names.

Shari shared more information about MI Bridges (an electronic resource) so that community agencies can be listed in 211 and be automatically be included in MI Bridges. **Action: put Shari on the coalition agenda for a presentation in January.**

### **Coalition Member Updates and Announcements**

Sara shared information on the Youth Photovoice project. We are hosting one in St. Johns. Capacity is 15. Hopefully we can circulate the completed Photovoice project around the county.

Haley – SafeCenter currently has two Clinton Co. residents in the shelter.

Joel shared that a proposal from all 3 health departments, CEI-CMH and Eaton RESA was submitted for funding for two years and \$500,000, Nourishing Through Barriers, to provide nutritional materials on cognitively impaired individuals, caregivers, parents, and peers. Good luck. We hope they receive the grant award.

Chris said his client base is strong. We're happy to hear that.

Marie- January 9<sup>th</sup> is the Nurture and Plan for parents of children birth to 18 months group is starting for moms and dads. Parenting class starting in Bath on Nurturing Parenting. Childcare is available. LeeAnna distributed the parenting education flyers.

Joel made a motion for the meeting to adjourn. Chris supported the motion. **Motion carried.**
