CSAPC Goal #1, Capacity Building	
Coalition Staff Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff the CSAP Coalition by maintaining consistent contact with partner agencies, organizations and individuals, recruiting members, organizing regular full and committee meetings, updating logic models, sharing information on professional development opportunities, conducting and reporting on needs assessment and program evaluation, close and regular collaboration with Drug Free Communities Grant Coordinator. • Offer technical assistance at multiple community meetings such as the Building Stronger Communities (BSCC), Vulnerable Adults Network, Court Appointed Special Advocates Board of Directors, BSCC Steering Committee, Healthy Capital Community, and other county meetings where the prevention focus is requested. • Provide technical assistance to schools related to prevention strategies and programming. Meetings with schools to secure MiPHY participation, review data, assess prevention needs, provide professional development. • Provide presentations on prevention topics to community groups as requested. • Assist with coordination and attend three Whole School, Whole Child, Whole Community meetings. Encourage representatives from all six Clinton School Districts to attend. • Facilitate the planning and coordination of CSAPC's 3rd Annual Prevention Forum. • Facilitate Mental Health 1st Aid training in Clinton County.

CSAPC Goal #2, Alcohol	
Coalition Staff Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Facilitate vendor education to at least 75% of the alcohol vendors in Clinton County. Assist with the coordination and evaluation of alcohol vendor education. • Support St. Johns Police Dept. (SJPD) and Clinton County Sheriff's Department in the completion of alcohol compliance checks for a minimum of 75% of alcohol vendors in Clinton County. • Support efforts to engage county middle and high school students to prevent alcohol use and other high-risk behaviors through PALs, SADD, and Most-Teens Don't. • In partnership with Drug Free Communities Grant (DFC), Dewitt Police Department, and St. Johns Police Department, implement Project Alert, student resiliency-refusal skills for Alcohol, Tobacco, and Other Drugs (NREPP, SAMHSA evidence based program) in 7th grade, St. Johns Middle School and DeWitt 7th grade students. • Facilitate and coordinate the county campaign to reduce parental support of underage drinking, following the process outlined by our DFC Consultant. • Promote alcohol-server training, TIPS® training, for both "on premise" and temporary alcohol vendors and explore other venues for sales of alcohol, e.g. golf courses and festival volunteers. • Facilitate the planning and coordination of CSAPC's ROSC Forum

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Design parent outreach packets on the topics of alcohol and marijuana and distribute 10 packets with educational and referral information to each of the middle and high schools in Clinton County to give to parents when their child has a discipline referral related to alcohol or marijuana. We can provide more as requested. • Provide Signs of Suicide (SOS) curriculum, training and consultation to school districts as requested. • Coordinate a pilot early intervention program with Ovid-Elsie School district, Child and Family Charities, and Clinton Sparrow Hospital to provide intervention and support to up to eight youth aged 12 - 16 who have been disciplined on campus for using drugs or alcohol. • Update the SUD Resource Directory by 9/30/18.
St. Johns and Dewitt Police Department	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Implement Project Alert lessons with fidelity to 7th graders in the St. John's and Dewitt School Districts. Administer and collect pre- and post-surveys.
St. Johns Police Department and Clinton Co. Sheriff's Dept.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide vendor education materials to at least 75% of the alcohol vendors in Clinton County. • Complete alcohol compliance checks for a minimum of 75% of alcohol vendors in Clinton County.
